

TOWN WARRANT.

THE STATE OF NEW HAMPSHIRE.

To the Inhabitants of the Town of Greenville, in the County of Hillsborough, in said State, qualified to vote in Town affairs.

You are hereby notified to meet at the Town Hall in said Greenville on Tuesday, the eleventh day of March next, at ten of the clock in the forenoon, to act upon the following subjects:

- 1. To choose all necessary town officers for the year ensuing.
- 2. To raise such sums of money as may be necessary to defray town charges for the ensuing year, and make appropriation of the same.
- 3. To hear the reports of agents, auditors, committees and officers heretofore chosen and pass any vote relating thereto.
- 4. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate a sum of money not exceeding sixty dollars for decorating soldiers' graves.
- 5. To see if the town will vote to authorize the selectmen and town treasurer to borrow money for the use of the town.
- 6. To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise and appropriate for the use of the library.
- 7. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate a sum of money sufficient to establish a public fountain

at the corner of Pleasant and Main streets, and lay pipes to take water for the same from the present fountain supply

pipe.

8. To see if the town will vote to buy land for cemetery purposes, grade and improve the same, and raise and appropriate such sum of money as may be necessary therefor, or take any other action relating thereto.

CEMETERY TRUSTEES.

During the past year there has been the usual amount of labor expended in the general care of the cemetery. In addition to this, much extra work has been done, many of the old neglected lots have been righted up, sand and gravel removed and the surface raised to a proper level with good loam, which, by the application of fertilizer and lawn seed, may be made a beautiful green.

The under-drain in the southern part of the cemetery was found to be filled solid with sand. Much labor was required to remove the sand, the drain being five or six feet deep, filled with stone and gravel.

During the year a bequest of one hundred dollars has been received from the estate of Maria A. Bacon.







SCHOOL REPORT.

The school board submits the following report:

The schools have been in session thirty-six weeks. At the beginning of the school year the school board was obliged to fill two vacancies, caused by the resignation of Miss Winifred Robbins and Miss May Morgan. Miss Fannie Blood was selected for the intermediate school and Miss Beatrice K. Taft for the primary school. On account of the scholars in the Reid district it was deemed best to share the cost of maintaining a school in the brick schoolhouse with the Mason school board. We have paid the tuition of one scholar to the Appleton academy.

By way of repairs we have had the building thoroughly cleaned, the walls kalsomined, and have put up new curtains in all the rooms, also had the building shingled. At the present time there are four grades in the grammar school, as there were enough scholars to form a high school class. The South and East schools have been closed and we have transported the scholars as in previous years.

Our schools have made good progress and we have been particularly fortunate in the fact that but few absences have been caused by sickness. We note with satisfaction the interest taken by the parents in visiting the schools. This not only gives encouragement to both teacher and pupil but is a source of pleasure to parents which should not be lost.
