# TOWN WARRANT.

## THE STATE OF NEW HAMPSHIRE.

*To the Inhabitants of the Town of Greenville, N. H., in the County of Hillsborough in said State, qualified to vote in town affairs.*

You are hereby notified to meet at the Town Hall in said Greenville on Tuesday, the twelfth day of March next, at Ten of the clock in the forenoon, to act upon the following subjects:

1. To choose all necessary Town Officers for the year ensuing.
2. To raise such sums of money as may be necessary to defray town charges for the ensuing year, and make appropriation of the same.
3. To hear reports of agents, auditors, committees and officers heretofore chosen and pass any vote relating thereto.
4. To see if this town will vote to authorize the selectmen and town treasurer to borrow money for the use of the town.
5. To see if the town will vote to raise a sum of money not exceeding sixty dollars for decorating soldiers' graves.
6. To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise and appropriate to liquidate the school fund.
7. To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise for use of the library.
8. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate the amount of money necessary to secure state aid for the permanent improvement of highways.

9. To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise and appropriate to exterminate the brown-tail and gypsy moths.
