#### TOWN WARRANT

#### THE STATE OF NEW HAMPSHIRE

To the Inhabitants of the Town of Greenville in the County of Hillsborough in said State, qualified to vote in Town Affairs:

You are hereby notified to meet at the Sacred Heart Church hall on Tuesday, the twelfth day of March next, between the hours of ten of the clock in the forenoon and five of the clock in the afternoon, then and there to bring in your ballots for the following town officers:

Town clerk for one year; town treasurer for one year; one selectman for three years; one selectman for two years; tax collector for one year; highway agent for one year; water commissioner for three years; chief of police for one year; cemetery trustee for three years; library trustee for three years; two auditors for one year; three fire wards for one year; sexton for one year.

The polls will close at five o'clock.

And at eight of the clock in the afternoon of the same day at the same place to act upon the following subjects:

- 1. To choose all necessary officers not chosen by the Australian ballot.
- 2. To raise such sums of money as may be necessary to defray town charges for the ensuing year and make appropriations of the same.
- 3. To hear reports of agents, auditors, committees and officers heretofore chosen, and pass any vote relating thereto.
- 4. To see if the town will vote to authorize the Selectmen and town treasurer to borrow money in anticipation of taxes, or take any action thereon.

- 5. To see if the town will vote to adopt the provisions of the municipal budget act, or take any action thereon.
- 6. To see if the town will vote to authorize the selectmen to appoint an overseer of the poor at a salary not to exceed \$100.00 per year, raise and appropriate money for same, or take any action thereon.
- 7. To see what action the town will take regarding the appointment of a town house committee, said committee to be authorized to have plans drawn for the repairing or rebuilding of the town house, and to submit them with recommendations to the town, at a date to which this meeting shall be adjourned.
- 8. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate a sum of money for the repairing or rebuilding of the town house, and appoint a committee to have supervision of such work, or take any action thereon.
- 9. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$200.01, the state to contribute \$800.04, these amounts to be used jointly as an emergency unemployment relief fund, and to be spent upon the Class V highways, so-called, or . . . will raise and appropriate the sum of \$1,773.00, the state to contribute a like amount, the money to be used jointly as a state aid construction fund, and must be spent upon the Happy Hollow road, so-called, starting near the farm of J. Willard Buttrick, or take any action thereon.
- 10. To see if the town will vote to place the appointment of the chief of police in the hands of the selectmen, instead of that official being elected by the voters as at present, or take any action thereon.
- 11. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$75.00 for the purpose of advertising the resources and natural advantages of the town, said sum to be expended under the direction of the selectmen, or take any action thereon.
- 12. To see if the town will appoint a zoning commission to consist of five members, to recommend boundaries for zoning districts in said town, and to recommend approximate regulations therefore, in accordance with the provision of Chapter 42, of the public laws.

- 13. To see if the town will vote to rebuild the sidewalk on Temple street, raise and appropriate money for the same, or take any action thereon.
- 14. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$1,500.00, the same to be spent in repairing the saw-mill bridge, so-called, to prevent further undermining of the piers, as recommended by the state highway department, or take any action thereon.
- 15. To see if the town will vote to appoint a committee to represent the townspeople in the matter of opposing any increase in the rates charged for electricity for local domestic and power purposes, and if possible obtaining a reduction in such rates, or take any action thereon.
- 16. To see if the town will vote to give a rebate on taxes paid on or before a certain date to be decided upon at this meeting, or take any action thereon.
- 17. To see if the town will vote to authorize the selectmen to administer or dispose of any real estate acquired by the town through tax collector's deeds.
- 18. To see if the town will vote to restore the 10 per cent cut to all town officials affected by the reduction of 1932, or take any action thereon.
- 19. To transact any other business that may legally come before said meeting.

#### Report of Firewards

The firewards have to report that during the fiscal year ending Jan. 31, 1935, there were three signal alarms for fire and numerous still alarms for chimney fires. The fire of July 6th which destroyed a barn on Mrs. Anise Fortin's property caused a loss of about \$150.

Since the above report was written the town has sustained a very serious fire loss by the partial burning of the Town House building Feb. 7th. About 8:30 p. m., on that day fire was discovered in a closet near the men's room. Firemen responded to the alarm with extinguishers; lines of hose were laid and for a time the fire was apparently under control. We believe, however, that it had been burning in the attic for some time and finally burst through the top of the building, destroying the roof and all the upper interior down to the second floor. The lower part was badly damaged by water. The loss is estimated at \$35,000. Aid was summoned from the Fitchburg, New Ipswich and Wilton Fire departments, each sending a booster pump, rendering valuable assistance in confining the fire to the Town building and protecting adjoining property. We tender to those Departments our sincere thanks.

## Report of School Board

To the Citizens of Greenville:

We herewith submit the following report:

Greenville received a certain amount of federal money for corrective work among school children, embracing tonsil operations, dental work and provision of glasses. Federal money is also furnishing milk each day, for undernourished children.

For the first time a prize speaking contest was conducted by the Americanization committee of the American Legion Auxiliary. The seventh and eighth grades participated and Greenville was very proud to have two of the three prizes awarded to Greenville pupils, Marjanet Sawyer, seventh grade and J. Willard Buttrick, Jr., eighth grade.

This fall the pupils in Mrs. Bennett's room presented an excellent play and musical act. The money realized will be used to defray graduation expenses and for a class trip. At the Memorial exercises the pupils in the first six grades furnished an unusually impressive and pleasing program.

Thirty-one pupils are attending High School, only two of whom will graduate in June. There will be an additional number from the graduating classes, necessitating a larger appropriation for high school tuitions.

Owing to the small number of children attending school it has been deemed advisable to close one of the rooms next fall and employ only two teachers. We regret that this seems necessary.

We desire to express our appreciation to Mrs. Frances Upham, our librarian, for her interest in the school children; to Miss Myrtle Marsh for her kindness in writing the graduates names on the diplomas each year; and to Mr. Alfred Williams for his helpful co-operation in the manual training work.

#### Report of Superintendent of Schools

To the School Board and Citizens of Greenville:

I respectfully submit my twelfth annual report as your Superintendent of Schools.

The State Legislature of 1933 enacted a provision requiring the State Board of Education to reduce the number of supervisory unions in the state from the sixty existing at that time to fifty-five in 1933-1934 and to fifty for 1934-1935. This second reduction resulted in the addition of Francestown and Greenfield to the six towns which formerly comprised Supervisory Union No. 63: Wilton, Greenville, Lyndeboro, Mason, New Ipswich and Temple. The new towns add approximately one hundred children and four teachers but the closing of two rural schools in Wilton leaves a net increase of only two teachers.

The Superintendent's time is not apportioned among the towns in the supervisory union by any fixed rule, but rather he is expected to give attention to each school according to its needs. It is too early to predict what the ultimate results of the change in this Union may be, but it is apparent now that each school will receive less attention than formerly, not only because there are more schools to be visited in a given time, but also because the increase in administrative duties necessarily reduces time available for visiting.

We are using standardized tests:

- A. To compare progress in the various schools with fair standards of accomplishment.
- B. To discover general weaknesses where they may exist in any school and point the way to improving teaching at such weak points.
- C. To assist the teachers in discovering the particular weaknesses and needs of individual children and help direct their instruction throughout the year.

The tests used include the Stanford Achievement Test which covers nearly all of the subjects taught in Grades 3-8. This test is given every year in October and is repeated in May for children whose October scores in the test were low. In Grades 1-3 we use the Gray Oral Reading Check Tests at intervals of five or six weeks throughout the year. We have begun this year to use the Metropolitan Primary Reading Test also in Grades 1-3 and Metropolitan Primary Arithmetic Test in Grades 2 and 3. These are given in

January. All tests are given by the teachers who follow very exact and minute directions in order that the tests may be given under uniform conditions in every school.

The form of report card was revised this year in order to provide for systematic reporting of each pupil's scores in the standardized tests, so as to give to parents a more complete picture of their children's success in school.

The annual medical inspection was made in October by Dr. Pease and Dr. Mason, in both the Public and Parochial Schools. They report as follows:

The budget estimates for the school year 1935-1936 are based upon the conclusion of the school board that the public school enrollment next year will be too small to justify the continuance of three teachers. Apparently there will be approximately fifty pupils, with very small numbers in the second and third grades especially. Consequently, the salary of one teacher has been taken from last year's estimate. There is also a small reduction in the estimated cost of transportation, because the actual cost this year is lower than was estimated. High school tuition shows a very large prospective increase, for the reason that of the 31 pupils attending various high schools now only two are in the graduating class; and there are eight public school and perhaps five parochial school eighth grade pupils who will wish to enter high school in September. Our best estimate is that \$3,000.00 will be required for this purpose.
