TOWN WARRANT

THE STATE OF NEW HAMPSHIRE

To the Inhabitants of the Town of Greenville in the County of Hillsborough in said State, qualified to vote in Town Affairs:

You are hereby notified to meet at the Town Hall in said Greenville on Tuesday, the fourteenth day of March next, between the hours of ten of the clock in the forenoon and six of the clock in the afternoon, then and there to bring in your ballots for the following town officers:

Town clerk for one year; one selectman for three years, town treasurer for one year; tax collector for one year; highway agent for one year; water commissioner for three years; cemetery trustee for three years; library trustee for three years; two auditors for one year; three firewards for one year.

And at eight of the clock in the afternoon of the same day at the same place to act upon the following subjects:

Article 1. To choose all necessary officers not chosen by the Australian ballot.

Article 2. To raise such sums of money as may be necessary to defray town charges for the ensuing year and make appropriations of the same

Article 3. To hear reports of agents, auditors, committees and officers heretofore chosen and pass any vote relating thereto.

Article 4. To see if the town will vote to authorize the selectmen and town treasurer to borrow money in anticipation of taxes, or take any action thereon.

Article 5. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate a sum of money to insure employes of the highway department, firemen, street lighting system and other liability insurance, or take any action thereon.

Article 6. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$221.61, the state to contribute \$886.43, these amounts to be used jointly as a relief fund and to be expended on Class V highways, so-called, or . . . will raise and appropriate the sum of \$1,794.00, the state to appropriate a like amount, the money to be used as a state construction fund, and must be spent on Route No. 123 or what has been known as the Turnpike, or take any action thereon.

Article 7. To see if the town will vote to place the operation and care of the town water system under the jurisdiction of the board of selectmen and abolish the board of water commissioners, or take any action thereon.

Article 8. To see if the town will vote to sell the building formerly used for fire department meetings, or take any action thereon.

Article 9. To see if the town will vote to authorize the selectmen to act as the Board of Public Welfare and Relief, designating the chairman as overseer of poor and the other two members as investigators, and raise and appropriate the sum of \$100.00, \$50.00 for the overseer and \$25.00 for each of the other two, or take any action thereon.

Article 10. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$120.00 to advertise the town through the Monadnock Region Association, or take any action thereon.

Article 11. To see if the town will vote to give a rebate on taxes paid on or before a certain date to be decided upon at this meeting, or take any action thereon.

Article 12. To see if the town will vote to authorize the selectmen to administer or dispose of any real estate acquired by the town through tax collector's deeds, or take any action thereon.

Article 13. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of two thousand dollars for the purpose of issuing and distributing circulars and other written or printed matter, calling attention to the resources and natural advantages of the town, or take any action thereon.

Article 14. To transact any other business that may legally come before said meeting.

REPORT OF THE OVERSEER OF THE POOR

I herewith submit my report as Overseer of Poor. The continuance of the unstable business conditions has kept our relief load rather constant.

Three years ago an Overseer of Poor was chosen as more or less of an emergency measure. It is my opinion that the relief question has ceased to be an emergency. It has not ceased to be a problem. Therefor I recommend that all welfare business in Greenville be placed in the hands of the Selectmen, with the Chairman designated as Overseer of Poor. With this arrangement the routine work can be easily taken care of resulting in a saving to the town. It should also prevent any exploitation of the office of Overseer, which is liable to result if the position is open to election each year. We must prevent the welfare business from becoming a political football.

The building situated on land of J. C. Taft and formerly used for firemen's meetings not being used for that purpose now, we recommend that it be sold.

REPORT OF SCHOOL BOARD

To the Citizens of Greenville:

We herewith submit the following report:

There are forty-four pupils in High School this year, ten of whom will graduate in June. We expect seventeen will graduate from the eighth grade this year, and all expect to attend High School. This will make fifty-one pupils in High School next year, and we have budgeted four thousand dollars for this item, an increase of one hundred dollars over last year.

While we will graduate a class of nine from the public School, we expect only four or five to enter the first grade next fall. With this reduction in enrollment, we have provided for only two teachers in the budget, and we estimate that each teacher will have about twenty scholars.

The school building is in very good repair, and we do not anticipate any large expenditures during the coming year.

REPORT OF SUPERINTENDENT OF SCHOOLS

To the School Board and Citizens of Greenville:

I respectfully submit my sixteenth annual report as Superintendent of Schools.

SUPERVISION

In my report of last year, I stated that we were giving special attention to Primary Reading and discussed the first two of the five stages in learning to read; namely, (1) the preparatory stage in which the teacher builds upon the experiences the children have had in the home and community and the background of ideas and the conversational ability they possess and (2) the three phases of the second stage, pre-primer, primer and first reader. These two stages are normally completed in the first grade. This year we are extending this emphasis on reading through the second grade and attempting to take each child at the level of reading ability which he has attained, and carry him on at his own best rate of progress.

The third stage in learning to read is a period of rapid growth in the fundamental habits of recognition of words and phrases and in the easy interpretation of meanings. This stage normally covers two years work,—that is, grades two and three. However, there are always found in the second grade some pupils who have not progressed farther than the first reader level, or even the primer level, at the beginning of the year; consequently any group of second grade children must be broken up into two or three sections corresponding to these levels of attainment.

In both the first and second grades we now report in considerable detail the progress each child is making in reading, in order that the parent may have a more complete picture of the child's abilities and handicaps and be in a position to discuss special problems with the teacher and cooperate with her in overcoming difficulties.

In grades above the second, the teachers are making special efforts to help pupils with their reading difficulties, first by determining so far as possible the cause of their handicaps and second by applying appropriate remedial measures through in-

dividual or group instruction and drill. Many of the factors that determine a child's success and rate of advancement in the primary grade reading still affect his progress in the later grades. The factors which are most important are those related to general health and emotional status.

Low general health is likely to retard progress in reading, prevent good memory, and even produce a dislike for reading because the effort required produces discomfort. Evidences of low general health, such as poor color, lack of energy, nervousness, restlessness, irritableness, getting tired easily, sagging posture, etc., must be remedied, if the child is to have a fair chance at learning, whether it be in the primary grades or at any later period in the child's school experience. Normal hearing and vision are also essential to success and we try to discover as early as possible any indication that a child does not hear distinctly and see readily and without eye strain. This is one of the important functions of the medical inspection and much good is accomplished by the nurse and school physician as well as by the family physician in discovering and correcting these physical handicaps.

A child's emotional stability plays a very important part in his success in learning. One who is still handicapped by habits of infancy, or by shyness, embarrassment and fears, or who gives way to temper tantrums, or for any reason is tense or strained, is very likely to lose confidence in himself and develop the attitude that he cannot read; his attention wanders, poor habits of perception develop, and the result is dislike for reading and for school.

Early discovery and intelligent treatment of the factors which prevent a child from making normal progress in learning to read, is the ideal which we are striving to attain. The success we achieve in this determines the success the pupil will have, and any failure of teachers or parents in this respect reduces the pupil's chance of success.

MEDICAL INSPECTION REPORT

The School District's decision to employ a school nurse and the subsequent employment of Mrs. Edna J. Gilbert, R. N.,

marks a decided advance in the medical inspection and health supervision.

Beginning September 29, Mrs. Gilbert assisted Dr. Karr making the regular annual health examination of all the pupils and teachers in both the Public School and the Sacred Heart School. Their report shows the following list of defects:

In addition to the medical inspection the nurse has weighed and measured 42 pupils in the Public School and 312 in the Sacred Heart School. She has reported 9 home visits, 2 business calls, 2 interviews with officials, 4 conferences, and has spent 16 hours working with the school physician and 63 hours total service. She reports 11 pupils excluded from the Public School until treatment for impetigo was completed. Also, she excluded from the Sacred Heart School 6 with scabies, and 5 with pediculosis until these conditions were corrected.

We hope that arrangements may be made in clinics for the correction of many of the defects, including teeth, tonsils and adenoids.

BUDGET

The School Board's estimate of money needed for the support of schools next year is practically the same as the estimate of a year ago and is only approximately \$200 more than the amount of the \$3.50 tax required by law to be raised and expended for this purpose. The amount of their estimate for other statutory requirements is almost exactly the same as last year and the total amount required to meet the School Board's Budget is \$4.50 less than last year. However we were able to reduce the assessment required last year by applying \$500 of the estimated cash balance together with the estimated amount of dog tax and tuition receipts; while this year the cash balance will not be large enough to be so applied and we have at the present time only one tuition pupil; consequently the assessment required for next year is \$8,900.

The reason for the small cash balance anticipated at the end of the current school year is the fact that we continued to employ three regular teachers this year, instead of only two as was contemplated when last year's budget was prepared. The enrollment has decreased and is likely to decrease still further next year due to the fact that there are nine pupils to graduate from the eighth grade and we know of only three or four to enter first grade in the fall. With three teachers, that would mean only twelve or thirteen pupils in each room and a total enrollment of probably no more than forty pupils.

With such a number in prospect it does not seem justifiable to continue employing three teachers.
