TOWN WARRANT

THE STATE OF NEW HAMPSHIRE

**To the Inhabitants of the Town of Greenville in the
County of Hillsborough in said State. qualified to vote
in Town Affairs**

You are hereby notified to meet at Town Hall in said Greenville on Tuesday the twelfth day of March next, at ten of the clock in the forenoon, then and there to bring in your ballots for the following town officers:

Town Clerk for one year; one Selectman for three years; Town Treasurer for one year; Tax Collector for one year; Highway Agent for one year; one Water Commissioner for three years; one Trustee of Trust Funds for three years; one Library Trustee for one year; two Auditors for one year and three Fire Wards for one year.

And at eight of the clock in the afternoon of the same day, at the same place, to act upon the following subjects:

Article 1. To choose all necessary officers not chosen by the Australian ballot.

Article 2. To raise such sums of money as may be necessary to defray town charges for the ensuing year and make appropriations for the same.

Article 3. To hear reports of agents, auditors, committees and officers heretofore chosen and pass any vote relating thereto.

Article 4. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the selectmen and town treasurer to borrow money in anticipation of taxes, or take any action thereon.

Article 5. To see if the Town will vote to petition the State Tax Commission to have an audit made by the Division of Municipal Accounting and raise and appropriate a sum of money to cover the expenses of such an audit.

Article 6. To see if the Town will vote to purchase a new electric stove for the Town Hall kitchen, payment for same to be taken from the accumulated interest from the M. M. Marsh trust fund.

Article 7. To see if the Town will vote to accept a certain tract of land from Mrs. Ernest Bernier leading from High Street for highway purposes according to a plan submitted to the selectmen, raise and appropriate a sum of money to build said highway, or take any action thereon.

Article 8. To see if the Town will vote to accept a bequest from the late Mary McKaig Taft, as a trust fund, or take any other action thereon.

Given under our hands and seal, this 18th day of February, in the year of our Lord nineteen hundred and fifty-seven.

**SYNOPSIS OF 1956 ANNUAL TOWN MEETING
MARCH 13, 1956**

Number of Ballots Cast — 449

The Meeting was called to order by the Moderator, William H. Doonan, at 10:08 a. m. and a prayer was offered by Reverend Ernest Brodeur. After the reading of the Warrant by the Moderator, it was voted that action on all articles beyond Article 1 be postponed to Thursday, March 15th, 1956, at 7:30 p. m.

At 4:55 p. m. it was voted to close the polls at 6:15 p. m.

For results of voting for Town Officers, see page 3 of this report.

On March 15th, 1956, at 7:30 p. m., the Meeting was called to order by the Moderator and the articles in the Warrant were disposed of as follows:

Article 1. For Town Officers chosen, see page 3 of this report.

Article 2. See Selectmen's report for Appropriations made. Special Appropriations were as follows: (1) \$100 was appropriated for the purchase of raincoats for the policemen. (2) It was voted to print, bind and distribute the 1956 inventory of property as assessed for tax purposes.

Article 3. Voted to accept reports of Agents, Auditors, Committees and Officers heretofore chosen as printed in the Town Report.

Article 4. Voted to authorize the Selectmen and Town Treasurer to borrow money in anticipation of taxes.

Article 5. Voted not to petition the State Tax Commission to have an audit made.

Article 6. Voted \$150 to explore and survey the Hodgman lot.

Article 7. Voted \$2,300 to improve and further remodel the firehouse.

Article 8. Voted \$1,520 for two-way radios.

Article 9. Voted to accept land from Honore Rousseau for highway purposes.

Article 10. Voted a sum not to exceed \$500 to purchase for the Town Hall Auditorium new curtain for the stage and shades for windows. This to be taken from the accumulated interest of M. M. Marsh Trust Fund.

Article 11. Voted to have the Selectmen appoint a committee to report at next Town Meeting, to make suggestions for improvement and repair of Common near World War 1 Memorial.

Article 12. Voted to authorize the Selectmen to select a site for a town dump. Voted to raise and appropriate a sum not to exceed \$1,000 for this purpose.

Article 13. Voted \$100 for purchase of land between Pleasant Street Cemetery and new Route 31.

Article 14. Voted \$500 to clear the remainder of land in the new part of the Pleasant Street Cemetery.

Article 15. Voted \$1,000 to paint the Library and the Ladies' and Men's Rooms in the Town Hall.

Article 16. Voted to accept a piece of land from Gurvin Work for highway use.

Voted to adjourn at 9:20 p. m.

Your Town Dump

Use it freely

Your town dump has been set up for your personal convenience. It provides a suitable place where you can dispose of the large amounts of dangerous, inflammable waste material and other useless items which accumulate around your household and local stores, brush, etc., cut on your property. The town dump has become a valuable and indispensable asset in modern community life.

The most successful town dumps are supervised—regular days provided for their use and inflammable material consistently burned. The town dump which receives no attention, where waste material is scattered about without supervision of any description, soon becomes a community menace and a liability rather than an asset.

Many people still burn debris around their homes. A large number of such fires get out of control causing unnecessary damage and expense to the burner. Why burn at home? Make use of your town dump and eliminate the hazard of burning. It will be easier for you—personally and financially.

If, however, you do burn on your premises:

1. Secure a permit from your local forest fire warden—the law requires it. The warden won't refuse you if conditions are safe.
2. Be sure to properly supervise your burning. Don't leave it.
3. Make certain your fire is DEAD OUT before leaving it.

Save yourself much possible difficulty.

Report of the Librarian to the Trustees:

I hereby submit the report of the Library for the year ending December 31, 1956.

It has been a pleasure to work for the trustees, Mr. Eugene H. Coffin, Mrs. J. Willard Buttrick, Sr. and Mr. Robert Taft. They have been most helpful and co-operative.

The library has been a busy place this year, with various organizations holding Committee Meetings and food sales, and the Girl Scouts using the Main room for their troop meetings during the early winter.

The library is open on Monday and Wednesday evenings from 7 to 9 and on Friday afternoons from 3 to 5. The Bookmobile has continued to make its quarterly visits and the State Library has been very helpful in the loaning of text books. I wish to extend my appreciation also to the help I have received from the Milford Library, through the loan of books to students.

In the retirement of Miss Catherine Pratt, assistant Librarian of the State Library, this year, our Library has lost a valuable friend. This year several books for the small children have been beautifully rebound by Mr. Leon Hardy. His gift has been gratefully acknowledged by the Trustees.

The reading contest sponsored by the Library was a huge success this year. It was called "The Modern American Explorer." Each child was given a map of the United States and for each book read a colored sticker of a State was pasted to the map. When finished the child had a very colorful map of the United States to take home.

Thirty-nine children qualified by reading the required two books. The contest was held from June 18th to July 27th and on August 7th a party was given for the children at the home of the Librarian. Games and refreshments were enjoyed and prizes were awarded to the three children reading the largest number of books. They were Maurice Lizotte, Brenda Caron and Elaine Caron.

At the request of the Sister Superior, 28 books for grades 1 through 6 were loaned to the Sacred Heart School for supplementary reading. Several books by Catholic authors have been added to the Library.

In November the Librarian gave a talk on "How to use the Library" to the boys and girls of the 6th, 7th and 8th grades of the Public School.

A new 10 volume set of Science Books for Elementary School age was purchased this year, and several new Junior Biographies and non-fiction books have been added.

For the small children, who accompany their mothers to the Library, a few color books and crayons have been put on the children's table and have proved to be most popular.

In December a winter scene depicting ice skaters was arranged on the children's table and enjoyed by everyone who came in. Santa and Frosty the snowman appeared just before Christmas.

The book, "A Treasury of Christmas Songs" was presented to the Library by the pupils of the Public School in memory of Dr. Harlan E. Karr, a library trustee and the school physician.

ANNUAL REPORT OF SCHOOL NURSE

This was a year when communicable disease was prevalent in the schools but did not reach epidemic proportions. There were measles, mumps, chicken pox, and whooping cough present during the school year, but luckily there were only a few cases of each, except the whooping cough. At the end of the school year German measles were introduced and no doubt will continue throughout the summer.

During the school year I made twelve visits to the Greenville Public School to check on the health of the children. There were a few cases of pediculosis but by the end of the year this pest had been eradicated.

I assisted Dr. Karr when he made his examination in November and sent notes to the parents of the children who showed defects. Records were maintained throughout the year on all the children as to weights, heights, and any other fact that might be useful in their health program, throughout the school.

The Polio Vaccine Clinics were held in Milford in October, 1955 for those children who had had the first shot in May, 1955. The P.T.A. provided transportation to carry the children to the clinic. In May, 1956 the Polio Vaccine was administered at the Public School for all children from the ages of 1-15 and also pregnant women, under the supervision of the State Health Department. The P.T.A. sponsored the clinic and provided clerks, nurses and lollipops to make the clinic a success. There were over 200 children inoculated at this time. I assisted in arranging for the clinic and also helped on the day of the clinic. At this time there is no date set for the second shot of vaccine.

By means of the Snellon Chart I screened the vision of the children and found three children in need of further examination. Notes were sent to the parents of the children. The hearing of the children was tested by means of the group-audiometer and indicated need for further testing on an individual basis. This will be done as soon as school opens in the fall.

In May I was fortunate to attend the National Convention of the American Nurses Association in Chicago as a representative of the School Nurses in New Hampshire. It was a thrilling and most worthwhile experience.

The work of the school nurse in the Sacred Heart School was complicated by two problems this year. My own illness at the beginning of the year and the illness of Dr. Harlan Karr. We were unable to finish the physical examinations of the children during the school year, but I checked for any noticeable handicap and this next year will strive to aid in doing a more thorough examination with the new school physician.

Communicable disease was present throughout the year. Whooping cough, measles, and colds were prevalent at the beginning and end of the year. I examined the children in June just prior to vacation and there were no pediculosis found.

The children attended the Polio Vaccine Clinic in October, 1955 at Milford to receive the second shot of the vaccine, and then in May 1956, 96 children were vaccinated at the School

during the State Health Polio Vaccine Clinic, which was sponsored by the Auxiliary of the Church. I assisted in arranging for the Clinic and also in the giving of the vaccine.

Records were maintained on all children and are available for future reference in case of need.

SUPERINTENDENT'S REPORT

To the School Board and Citizens of Greenville:

I respectfully submit my tenth annual report as your Superintendent of Schools.

STAFF AND INSTRUCTION

When the Greenville Public School opened this fall, it opened with two new members on the staff; Mr. Romuald Sinkervitch assumed the duties of Principal and teacher of grades 6, 7 and 8, replacing Mr. Elliott Barron who accepted a position at Appleton Academy, New Ipswich, and Mrs. Anita Sinkervitch, who was assigned the teaching duties in grades 3, 4 and 5, replacing Mrs. Lillian Maynard, who accepted a position in the New Ipswich Central School. Mr. Sinkervitch is a graduate of the University of Georgia, with a Masters Degree from Teachers College, Columbia. He has had several years of teaching experience, the most recent being in the Amherst, N. H. school system. Mrs. Sinkervitch is a graduate of the University of N. H. and did graduate work in education at the University of Georgia. Her last teaching experience was in Hollis, N. H.

Mrs. Edna LaPierre continues as the primary teacher, teaching grades 1 and 2. Miss Elsie Wheeler continues as the teacher and supervisor of the music program.

Our Instrumental Music program started again this fall under the direction of Mr. Edward Hamilton. However, waning interest has made it necessary to drop this program. If and when, interest in this part of our educational program warrants it, arrangements will be made to start it again. The past few years I have mentioned the desirability of having this program financed from school district funds rather than by the individual parents. I feel that the expense to the individual parents has had a great influence upon the number of pupils participating. We have pupils who have musical talents and it is unfortunate that we do not provide them an opportunity to express themselves. Again I wish to state that the cost of this program would be approximately \$200. This amount could be voted into the budget at the district meeting.

The instructional emphasis this year throughout Supervisory Union No. 63 has been in the area of science. Each year an attempt is made to focus our attention on a specific area with the thought that this will keep our instruction in tune with the times. However, every effort is made to keep all other areas of instruction in proper balance. Part of this emphasis was stimulated by an extension course in the "Teaching of Science in the Elementary School," which was offered in the Union, through the cooperation of Keene Teachers College. Many of the teachers in this Union attended.

We are continuing our efforts in the development of good reading habits, and reading skills. Our library program continues to function effectively with the cooperation of Mrs. Russell Kimball, Greenville Librarian. She has given our pupils several talks relative to the use of public libraries and the services they render. Her guidance in the selection of good reading materials has been very helpful.

I wish to commend Mrs. Robert Phipps, for the assistance she has given the staff in the area of reading. She has volunteered her services to help those children who have had difficulty in attaining proficiency in certain reading skills. This program has taken place each Tuesday and Thursday mornings and has been an effective supplement to the regular reading program.

Our health services at the Public School and Sacred Heart School are being carefully supervised by Miss Sybil Beatham and Dr. Wellwood. The School Nurse Report explains the type of service being rendered.

The citizens of Greenville should be made aware of the fact that it is becoming increasingly difficult to obtain and retain teachers in schools having multiple grades. Teachers are more interested in teaching single grades than combined grades. The demand for elementary teachers is so great that there are many more positions than there are qualified candidates to fill them. Consequently, teachers are in a position where they can pick and choose their positions. Our experience with teachers in grades 3 through 8 has proven this point. A constant change in staff makes it difficult for parents, children and teachers. Continual adjustments to different personalities, techniques and procedures, are necessary. A coherent philosophy of education is difficult to maintain. Therefore, Greenville's problem of obtaining, and retaining qualified teachers, so that an effective educational program can be offered, is reduced to the necessity of offering a salary program that is equal to or slightly better than that in the surrounding communities. To date we have been able to do this and it is our plan to offer salaries that will be attractive to teachers who desire to work in this area.

If, and when, the Greenville Public School enrollment warrants it, every effort should be made to employ a fourth teacher so that the number of grades per room, per teacher, can be reduced to two. A study of the school census projected to 1960-61, indicates that our building totals will vary from 77 to 61, depending of course on the number that will attend the Sacred Heart School. During this period, it would appear that our enrollment will not warrant a fourth teacher.

One might raise the question of whether or not tuition pupils from Mason would assist us in providing a fourth teacher and thereby assist in the expense of such instruction. Mason's problem is how to handle the 7th and 8th grades. If Mason's 7th and 8th graders were to be combined with the Greenville

7th and 8th grades, the enrollment in the room housing these two grades would comprise 37 pupils in 1957-58; 35 in 1958-59 and 40 in 1959-60. The size of our classrooms are such that they cannot adequately handle more than 30 pupils to a room. Consequently, we would be crowding our school in certain grades, and educationally would not be improving the situation as it presently exists.

The School Board carefully studied this possibility and found it not practical and financially not sound. The tuitions from Mason in 1957-58 would realize an income of approximately \$2,800 as against an immediate expenditure of \$4,000 for an additional teacher and equipment for the additional classroom. There would be some expense in operating the fourth classroom, however this should not be great.

BUILDING AND GROUNDS

This past summer the following work was completed on the school building. The exterior of the building was given one coat of paint; a new door was installed on the right side entrance to the building and storm sash was installed in the teachers' room. Our plant is in very good condition. Minor maintenance expenses are necessary, however no major expense is contemplated. The School Board's Budget for 1957-58, provides an amount of \$175 to replace the door on the left side entrance, thereby making this entrance more airtight.

FINANCE

The School Board's Budget for 1957-58 calls for an appropriation of \$40,286.66 an increase of \$2,235.45. The increase is reflected in the following areas: Administration \$200.47, a statutory obligation; teachers' salaries \$700; custodial salaries \$100; fuel \$100; health supervision \$30; tuitions \$2,165, a statutory obligation; teachers' retirement \$45.58, a statutory obligation; insurance and miscellaneous items \$18.40.

Decreases amounting to \$1,124 are accounted for in the following items: Repairs \$650; transportation \$314; equipment \$160.

It will be noted that the largest single expenditure in the budget is that of tuitions. It is anticipated that there will be 45 pupils from Greenville attending Appleton Academy at a cost of \$325 per pupil and 5 attending Peterborough at an estimated cost of \$350 per pupil. The tuition item will continue to increase as the tuition rate rises and the number of pupils, for whom the district is responsible, increases. It is conceivable, that by 1961-62, Greenville will have 85 pupils attending a public high school.

CONCLUSION

I wish to again express my appreciation to the Greenville School Board and the citizens of Greenville for their cooperation and excellent assistance given to me the past year. I also wish to thank the Greenville P. T. A. for their help and interest in school affairs.
