## TOWN WARRANT

### The State of New Hampshire

*To the Inhabitants of the Town of Greenville in the County of Hillsborough in said State, qualified to vote in Town Affairs:*

You are hereby notified to meet at Community Hall in said Greenville on Tuesday, the 11th day of March, next at ten of the clock in the forenoon, to act upon the following subjects:

*Bring in your ballots for:*

Town Clerk for one year, one Selectman for three years, Town Treasurer for one year, one Water Commissioner for three years, one Trustee of Trust Funds for three years, one Library Trustee for three years, one Library Trustee for one year, two Auditors for one year and one Fire Ward for three years.

And at eight of the clock in the afternoon of the same day, at the Town Hall Auditorium to act upon the following subjects:

#### Article 1.

To choose all necessary officers not chosen by the Australian Ballot.

#### Article 2.

To raise such sums of money as may be necessary to defray town charges for the ensuing year and make appropriations for the same.

#### Article 3.

To hear the reports of agents, auditors, committees and officers heretofore chosen, and pass any vote relating thereto.

#### Article 4.

To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen and Town Treasurer to borrow money in anticipation of taxes or take any action thereon.

#### Article 5.

To see if the Town will vote to have a Budget Committee of seven (7) to be appointed by the Moderator, or take any action thereon.

Article 6.

To see if the Town will vote to rescind the vote pertaining to the management of all matters concerning the supplying of water for drinking and domestic purposes for the citizens of the Town of Greenville passed at the Annual Town Meeting held on March 9, 1915, and place the management in the hands of a Superintendent, said Superintendent and a Treasurer to be Appointed and supervised by the Selectmen, remuneration for services of said Superintendent and Treasurer to be fixed by the Board of Selectmen and to be paid out of receipts of the Water Department. Upon passage to take effect July 1, 1969. (By Petition)

Article 7.

To see if the Town will vote to appropriate the sum of Fourteen Thousand Three Hundred Dollars (\$14,300) such sum to be raised through the issuance of bonds or note payable at \$3000 per year, for a study and preliminary design of a sewage collection system and sewage treatment facility for the Town, and to authorize the Selectmen to execute any and all contracts or agreements and to take such other action as may be necessary and proper to accomplish said study.

Article 8.

To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of Five Hundred Dollars (\$500) for the acquisition of options for land and easements for sewers and sewage treatment facilities, and to authorize the Selectmen to negotiate for and enter into such option agreements.

Article 9.

To see if the Town will vote to accept from the Greenville Boys Club a parcel of land formerly owned by Stanley Pucko, to be added to the Ida Taft Memorial Field, as suggested by the State Recreation Director. Said land surveyed by J. R. Blais Associates. Provided the Recreation Association installs a fence running from South to West, and a gate to be installed at the entrance of the Greenville Public School yard, or take any action thereon.

Article 10.

To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$800.00 to purchase a communication radio for the Police Department or take any action thereon.

Article 11.

To see if the Town will vote to continue the street sign program, raise and appropriate the sum of \$250.00 or take any action thereon.

Article 12.

To see if the Town will vote to accept the roadway, known as Acton Court situated between Mill Street and Mill Yard fence (running North to South) bounded by the properties of Charles D. Proulx and "Joe" Robichaud on one side and the land leading to Souhegan River on the other side, as described in a certain deed to be transferred to the Town of Greenville by the Greenville Real Estate Co. or take any action thereon. (By Petition)

Article 13.

To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to administer, or dispose of any real estate acquired by the Town through Tax Collector's Deeds or take any other action thereon.

Article 14.

To transact any other business that may properly come before this meeting.

Article 6: Voted to transfer not over \$1,500.00 from the Myrtle M. Marsh Fund for improvement of the Ida Taft Memorial Field.

Article 7: Voted to raise and appropriate \$800.00 to buy a new communication radio for the Police Department.

Article 8: Voted to accept the parcels of land from Honore and Marie Anne Rousseau as described in the Warrant.

Article 9: Voted to raise and appropriate not over \$3,000.00 to rough Bacon Avenue and Adams Avenue for a town highway.

Article 10: Voted to authorize the Selectmen to administer or dispose of any real estate acquired by the Town through Tax Collector's deeds.

Article 11: Voted to give the Selectmen authority to make policy regarding smoking and the use of alcoholic beverages in the Town Hall auditorium.

Article 12: Voted to pass over the article in regard to cutting trees along the public highways.



Article 13: Voted to raise and appropriate \$200.00 for an exhaust fan for the Fire Department.

Article 14: Voted not to raise and appropriate \$1,500.00 for new boots, coats and hats for the Fire Department.

Article 15: Voted to pass over the article in regard to placing the management of the Water Commission in the hands of the Selectmen.

Article 16: Voted to accept any Federal funds that may be available under the Land and Water Conservation Fund Act of 1965 and to designate the Board of Selectmen as the official representatives of the Town.

Voted not to accept any additional parcels of land for the purpose of town roads until the highway is built to Town specifications of a finished grade.

The meeting was ajourned at 12:32 a. m.

In reply to a request of the first session of this town meeting and of the selectmen that I change the auditors' figures of tax collector's report to agree with the treasurer's report, upon advice of counsel not to change auditors' report, I have not done so. Below is the auditors' correction of the unredeemed tax report as I filed it which I believed at the time, had no relationship to the treasurer's report.

At this point, I want to apologize to those 15 or so citizens who were embarrassed because I did not enter credit in all 4 or 5 places that I should have. No one was hurt financially but I did make some honest errors. Again I say I am sorry.

For one person to attempt to keep approximately 1500 accounts straight with 25 phone calls some days complaining about their taxbills or the water situation is almost impossible. Especially is this true when one tries to get potable water, tries to keep expenses down, tries to collect delinquent water accounts and tries to learn other information pertinent to the new water system. In short I bit off more than I could chew.

In other words if you see something wrong you have to step on someone's toes to correct it and in my case the name of the game became "Get Sawyer."

I am happy that in one instance I saved the town \$40,000.00 at least temporarily.

The Water Resources Board recommended that the Water Commissioners notify their customers to install 'pressure valves,' but so far as I know this was not done.

People cause fires. Our records show that the number of fires increase in an area as the population increases and our state is growing tremendously. This means that we all must be aware of fire causes and do our best to prevent their occurrence.

When we are very young the lighted match is an adventure, burn fingers and a dropped match is another fire. A little older we like to have a woodland cookout, or go out by ourselves for a smoke but fire and forests get together for another statistic. We adults like to clean up in the spring, burn the old debris and the dead grass, result — escaped fires and much personal expense.

With new homes and summer cottages located in woodlands and with abandoned fields and forests crowding the back yard of our villages' streets, it is necessary that everyone be aware all through the fire season, which comes with the disappearance of the snow, of the need to be careful with outdoor fires and fire sources.

The following action will help:

1. To teach our children the danger of lighted matches.
2. To *never* discard lighted smoking material from a car or while walking through fields or woods.
3. To safely dispose of rubbish preferably at the town dump. If you must burn —
  - a. You need a written permit from the town fire warden for *all* debris burning except when the ground is covered with snow. Cooking fires in outdoor fireplaces or in charcoal braziers in your own back yard is permitted on notification of the warden.
  - b. The warden is forbidden by regulation to allow burning of household rubbish on *grass* by householders between 9:00 A.M. and 5:00 P.M.
  - c. Have equipment on hand to control the fire *before* you light the match.
4. Promptly report any fire out of control to your fire warden or fire department.

Help to keep our town out of the fire occurrence column  
and save your tax dollars for useful purposes.

## REPORT OF THE LIBRARIAN

To the Trustees of the Chamberlin Free Public Library  
December 31, 1968

It is gratifying to report that 186 more adults patronized the Library this year than in 1967. The younger generation continue to be regular users of the Library. A total of 11,392 books and magazines was circulated this past year, a gain of 434 over the figure for the previous year. A total of 594 new books has been added to the collection: 126 books for young people and 368 books for adults.

The Librarian has attended four book selection meetings, held in Milford, Wilton, Rindge and Amherst. These meetings are helpful as they give the Librarian a chance to see new books before purchasing and to have many of them reviewed.

Our movie projector and screen were delivered in February, and our first film program was held on March 23, 1968. Since that date we have shown thirty-two different films. The average attendance was 48, with a high of 125 youngsters for the first showing and a low of 10 because of stormy weather. The films will be shown the last Saturday of each month through June, 1969. During July and August the program will be discontinued and will be resumed in September, 1969. We will be ever grateful to the American Legion for making this program possible by its generous gift of the projector and screen.

Memorial books have been presented to the Library in memory of Mrs. Etta Livingston, Mrs. Hazel Kimball Robinson, Mrs. Edna LaPierre, Mr. Albert Paradis, Miss Beatrice Taft and Mrs. Helene Greene.

The \$100.00 of State Aid for reference books was used towards the purchase of the Encyclopedia Americana. This \$100.00 grant from the State each year has helped tremendously in keeping our reference department up to date.

Also received as a gift from the State are ten large print books. These include:

There are many more titles available, for borrowing, from the Bookmobile. These books are for the use of adults and young people with vision difficulties.

The Bookmobile made three visits during the year, and a total of 556 books was borrowed — an average of 185 books each trip.

In order to meet the needs of our patrons, 60 books, covering a diversity of subjects, were borrowed from the State Library.

In October the Library received a gift of 50 records from the R C A recording company. These may be borrowed for a two-week period and checked out in the same way as a book. Since October we have had 97 circulations of records among 15 adults and 25 young people.

Many gift books have been added to our collection through the generosity of The American Legion, Marguerite Butler, Helene Greene, Helen Nutting, Dorothy Russell, Russell Kimball, Denise Laferriere and Bronson Potter. Magazine subscriptions have been presented to the Library by Esther Kimball, Robert Taft, J. W. Buttrick, Mrs. Bertrand Pelletier and The American Legion. A new magazine, given by the publisher as a trial subscription and proving to be very popular, is *The Antique Journal*. We are most grateful for all gifts of books and magazines.

The Librarian has had a busy year. On March 21, 1968, she enrolled in a ten-week course in Children's Services in the Public Library. This course was held at Keene State College, at Keene. From October 1, 1968, to December 10, 1968, the Librarian took a course in Cataloging at Keene State College. These courses are offered by the University of New Hampshire Extension Service and the State Library. Both courses proved to be very helpful.

In April a Reference Workshop was held at the District Office in Keene. This was a most interesting Workshop



and a day well spent. In September a Mending Workshop was also held at the Keene Office. Each Librarian attending received a small mending kit and many excellent tips on prolonging the life of a book.

The Librarian and Mrs. Lea Burnap attended the National Library Week luncheon at the N.H. Highway Hotel. This was the "kick-off" for National Library Week celebrations. Our Library held an Open House on April 25, 1968. We featured a hobby display of ceramics, wood-carvings and paintings, by local talent. Some 66 persons enjoyed the exhibits and the films shown as a part of the program. Delicious refreshments were served by the Friends of the Library.

The 8th annual Pops Concert was held in May and was most successful. The Friends of the Library who sponsored this event, gave the Library \$400.00 from the proceeds. This was especially needed for books this year as our book appropriation was cut by \$300.00 at the Town Meeting in March.

During the summer a Story Hour was held each Friday afternoon for pre-school children and 6- and 7-year-olds. A total of 31 children attended the Story Hours and 24 were present for the party, held at the Library, on the final session. Refreshments and balloons were furnished by the Librarian and the Friends of the Library.

A Bookworm Reading program was conducted from June through August for any child who wished to participate. It was necessary to read four books to be eligible for the party at the end of the program. Some 38 youngsters attended the cookout, at the home of the Librarian on August 31, 1968. Games were enjoyed and "eats" were furnished by the Friends of the Library. Mr. Kimball was kept busy at the grill barbecuing hamburgers, and later slicing watermelon!

Mrs. Dorothy Russell, Mr. Kimball and the Librarian attended the annual Friends' Dinner at the Wayfarer. The program was on the Film Services offered by the State Library and was very interesting. The Librarian and Mr. Kimball also attended the Open House on October 20, for the newly renovated Library in Bedford, New Hampshire. It was a most pleasant occasion — but, I'm afraid this Librarian was more than a little envious.

We were saddened this year by the death of Mrs. Helene

Greene, who was for many years a Trustee and Treasurer of the Chamberlin Library. She was also a member of the Friends of the Library and served as their Secretary and Treasurer. Mrs. Greene was a true friend of the Library, and she will be greatly missed.

Miss Elsie Wheeler was appointed by the Selectmen to serve as Trustee until March, 1969. The Trustees elected Miss Wheeler to serve as Treasurer of the Library and also to be the delegate to the Advisory Council of our district.

The Library is now open seventeen hours a week. The hours are:

Monday Evenings.....	7 - 9 P.M.
Tuesday Afternoons .....	1 - 5 P.M.
Wednesday Evenings.....	7 - 9 P.M.
Thursday Afternoons .....	1 - 5:30 P.M.
Friday Afternoons.....	1 - 5:30 P.M.

The school children come to the Library, by classes, every Thursday and Friday afternoon. Because of the extra-large classes it is necessary to have the two 1st and 2nd grades come on one day and the two 3rd and 4th grades on the following day. The 4th grade with their teacher, have also spent an English period at the Library learning to use the card catalog and to locate non-fiction and fiction books on the shelves. This will be of help to the youngsters as well as to the Librarian.

Miss Lise Thibault has worked as an aide in the Library this year. She was able to carry on most efficiently during the Librarian's vacation, so the Library did not have to be closed this summer.

Mr. Russell Kimball, an unofficial assistant, is most helpful and is appreciated by both the patrons and the Librarian. Who else would run the projector, keep the 5-year file of magazines straight, and do 1001 other odd jobs. A heartfelt thank you. Our thanks, also, to all who in any way help to make the Library one that Greenville can be proud to support. Make use of its facilities, for an informed public, or nation, is a strong one.

As instructed by the voters at the last annual Town Meeting, the Town Salaries Committee has met and we present herewith our findings and recommendations.

The following were the main considerations which guided this committee:

1. We recognize that our town officers have served well, that work loads are increasing, and raises seem justifiable.
2. We are also acutely aware of the town's financial condition and the necessity of keeping town expenses and the resultant tax rate within reason.
3. An analysis of salaries paid by area towns indicates that our salaries are in line with others except for the position of Tax Collector. According to our survey, Greenville's Tax

Collector seems to be receiving about \$200 less than the average for the area.

Based on the above consideration, we respectfully submit for the Town's consideration the following recommended pay increases.

## SUPERINTENDENT'S REPORT

To the pre-existing School Board and Citizens of Greenville:

I submit this abbreviated report relative to the activities of the school district from the time of the final school district meeting held in March 1968 until June 30, 1968. At this time Mascenic Regional School District assumed full operating responsibility for the schools in Greenville.

All plans for closing out of the district proceeded as projected, except that late in the fiscal year the State Tax Commission, Municipal Accounting Division, indicated that it would be a physical impossibility for their office to audit the accounts of the district of Greenville because of insufficient personnel. The local school board, therefore, assumed the responsibility of finding local auditors to conduct a careful and detailed audit. This audit was completed, is reported herein, and meets all State requirements.

The accounts of the district were closed in good order providing a net balance in Greenville of \$1,395.47. Even though the district authorized the raising and appropriating of \$1,000.00 to cover any unanticipated expenditures expended between the time of the March meeting and the end of the year; actually, no additional was required by the board to meet unexpected expenses. As provided by an article in the Warrant, this net balance has been transferred to the Mascenic Regional School District and has been credited toward Greenville's share of funds necessary for operating the Mascenic Regional School District in 1968-69. All reports of the treasurer and bookkeeper of the school district have been stored within the community at the Selectmen's Office in Greenville, and should be on hand for review for a period of seven years.

The transfer of administrative responsibility from the town district to the Mascenic Regional School District has been accomplished with minimal problems and confusion due to the continuance of personnel for both districts.
