The State of New Hampshire

The polls will be open from 10:00 a.m. to 6:00 p.m.

To the Inhabitants of the Town of Greenville in the County of Hillsborough in said State, qualified to vote in Town Affairs:

You are hereby notified to meet at Community Hall in said Greenville on Tuesday, the fifth day of March, next at ten of the clock in the forenoon, to act upon the following subjects:

Bring in your votes for: Town Clerk for one year; one Selectman for three years; Town Treasurer for one year; Tax Collector for one year; Highway Agent for one year; one Trustee of Trust Funds for three years; two Auditors for one year; one Library Trustee for three years; one Fireward for three years; one Parks & Playground Commissioner for five years; one Parks & Playground Commissioner for four years; one Parks & Playground Commissioner for three years; one Parks & Playground Commissioner for two years; and one Parks & Playground Commissioner for one year.

Article 1.

To raise and appropriate the sum of \$2,570,078.00 for the purpose of financing and constructing a municipal sewage disposal system, including sewerage, interceptors, pumping stations, treatment works, and such other related facilities inclusive of land acquisition, easements and rights-of-way as are required, such sum to be raised by the issuance of not exceeding \$2,570,078.00 in Serial Bonds or Notes under and in compliance with the provisions of the Municipal Finance Act (Chapter 33 of the New Hampshire Statutes Annotated 1955 and any amendments thereto) and to authorize the Selectmen to issue and negotiate such bonds or notes and to determine the rate of interest thereon, and to take such other actions as may be necessary to effect the issuance, negotiation, sale and delivery of such bonds or notes as shall be in the best interests of the Town of Greenville, and pass any vote relating thereto.

And at eight of the clock in the afternoon of the same day, at the Town Hall Auditorium to act upon the following subjects:

Article 2.

To choose all necessary officers not chosen by the Australian ballot.

Article 3.

To raise such sums of money as may be necessary to defray town charges for the ensuing year and make appropriation for the same.

Article 4.

To hear the reports of Auditors, Agents, Committees, and Officers heretofore chosen and pass any vote relating thereto.

Article 5.

To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen and Town Treasurer to borrow money in anticipation of taxes, or take any action thereon.

Article 6.

To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$4,000 Dollars to rebuild the retaining wall at the fire station, or take any action thereon.

Article 7.

To see if the Town will vote to install a street light on Temple Road, near the Bernard Robida residence, raise and appropriate the sum of Fifty Dollars (\$50.00), or take any action thereon. (By Petition)

Article 8.

To see if the Town will vote to rescind the vote taken on Article 18 at Annual Meeting 1973 pertaining to election of Parks & Playground Commission, thereby leaving such committee to be appointed by the Board of Selectmen. Article 9.

To see if the Town will vote to appropriate the sum of Fifteen Hundred Dollars (\$1,500) to purchase three mobile two-way radios for the Fire Department, and authorize the withdrawal of this amount from the Revenue Sharing Fund to be transferred to the general administration account, or take any action thereon.

Article 10.

To see if the Town will vote to rebuild Old Ashby Road from Route 31 to Hazelton property. Raise and appropriate a sum not to exceed Fourteen Thousand Dollars (\$14,000) and authorize the Selectmen to borrow said amount and issue serial notes for five years.

Article 11.

To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of One Thousand Dollars (\$1,000) for the purchase of a 4 Channel Radio for the Police Department, or take any action thereon.

Article 12.

To see if the Town will vote to appropriate the sum of Twenty-one Thousand Five Hundred Dollars (\$21,500) for the purchase of the former Greenville Electric Co. office building from Public Service Co. of New Hampshire, and authorize the withdrawal of this amount from the Revenue Sharing Fund to be transferred to the General Administration account.

Article 13.

To see if the Town will vote to join with other communities to use a particular solid waste disposal facility, with each participating community paying their pro-rata share of the costs of establishing such a facility and the operating costs thereof, as permitted under R.S.A. 53-A.

To transact any other business that may legally come before this meeting.

ditions the school was re-keyed and outside lighting added.

We should continue the progress made in maintenance this past year so that all of our schools will be in an excellent state of repair.

As stated in my previous report, we were able to take care of the needs of the school children educationally and to make the necessary repairs to the facilities as they developed through the year, and were able to still bring forward an unexpended balance. This present year, however, is going to be a difficult one; in that the prices of fuel, paper, and other budgetary items have increased tremendously since the budget was prepared eighteen months ago.

As I conclude this report I would like to give a special thanks to all in the Mascenic Regional School District for the vote of confidence last year in providing the monies necessary to carry out the many improvements that have been made in our school system.

side wall in the original section was repaired; this included replacement of the wooden plate over the windows, replacement of jack studs, and replastering that section of wall.

Before shingling the original section of the roof, with 290 weight shingles, it was necessary, due to dry rot, to replace the old boards with plywood and add a drip edge to solve leakage problems. Repairs were made to the screens, and a key control system was established for the first time to improve the security coverage for the building and its contents.

Work at the Greenville Public School included: replacing the damaged wood stairs on the fire escape on the north side of the building; pointing up the entire exterior of the foundation wall; installing a new solid core door and jamb in the boys' toilet area, as well as removing a large bump in the corridor floor at the entrance way; reshingling the front portion of the main roof; pointing a portion of the chimney which is above the roof level; scraping the exterior of the building, sealing and painting where necessary; patching and paving the walks and playgrounds; installing a new chain-linked fence and gate in front of the school, and repairing the existing fence, which improved the security conditions for the building.

The only work done at the Sacred Heart School was the addition of an automatic water feeder to the boiler, as the

exterior of this school was painted a year ago.

At the New Ipswich Central School all roof flashings were cleaned and sealed; one coat of silicone was applied to the exterior brick facings; all exterior trim, including windows and doors, were given one coat of paint; the sliding cafeteria door between the serving counter and the kitchen was repaired; in the two basement classrooms, drop ceilings were installed, partitions were extended to the ceiling to eliminate the noise factor, a new solid core door with a view panel was installed; an extension of the bell system was installed to make sure the fire alarm system was audible; it was necessary to change the lighting in the basement corridor; the hot water going to the girls' and boys' toilet areas has been tempered, eliminating the chances of any pupil getting burned; and to improve security con-

MASCENIC REGIONAL SCHOOL DISTRICT REPORT OF THE SUPERINTENDENT OF SCHOOLS

Carl E. Bowers

When our schools opened for the year, we found many changes, not only in staffing, but also in many other projects

that had been completed during the summer.

Our rate of staff turnovers was still on the high side at the Mascenic Regional School, but only a few replacements were necessary at the Elementary Schools. Reasons for the termination of employment were as follows: illness,

personal, retirement, and to teach out of state.

For the past few years we have been working towards continuity in our curriculum in all our elementary schools, so that the students will be exposed to like programs; thus making the transition to the Mascenic Regional School less difficult. This year we were able to provide new texts in Social Studies for grades three through five; make a concerted effort to improve the Handwriting Program in the area of Language Arts; and complete the Mathematics Program for all elementary grades, by making replacements in texts as necessary.

Many teachers have been participating in the course, "Reading in the Middle School," an In-Service Program

made available for the staff.

We appreciate Mr. Thomas Mohan's cooperation in rescheduling his Art and Music Programs at the Mascenic Regional School, so that we could provide Art and Music instruction, once again, in all of our elementary schools. This has been greatly appreciated not only by the teaching staff but by the parents of the children.

All the staff at the Mascenic Regional School, under the guidance of Mr. Mohan, have been working on various committees in preparation for the Schools Evaluations by the New England Association of Schools and Colleges. More information will be available after the study has been

completed, tentatively the middle of May 1974.

Our long range plans in the area of maintenance have been continued with the following accomplishments:

SOUHEGAN VALLEY AMBULANCE DISTRICT SERVICE

Annual Report

March of 1972, the four towns appropriated the sum of \$2.00 per capita amounting to \$8,900.00, to support the ambulance service for September 1, 1972 to August 31, 1973. The actual cost of operations for that period was \$8,424.73. Receipts for services rendered totaled \$2,484.88, leaving a surplus of \$3,365.15.

In March of 1973, the towns appropriated the sum of \$1.00 per capita amounting to \$4,450.00, to cover cost of operations from September 1, 1973 to March 1974. Actual cost of operations from September 1, 1973 to December 31, 1973 total \$5,665.28. Therefore, the \$4,450.00 plus the surplus from the first year, less the \$5,665.28 leaves us with

\$3,191.08 to operate for the next three months.

This year the towns will be asked to appropriate the sum of \$2.50 per capita. There are several reasons for this 50¢ increase, the first being that within the sixteen months of operation, two of the three ambulances were replaced at a cost of \$5,000.00. We anticipate the need of replacing the third ambulance this year. The cost of ambulance and radio maintenance, supplies and equipment have increased. There is also continuous need to increase the number of volunteers on the service and to provide training for these volunteers.

In the sixteen months of operation, the ambulance service has answered a total of 180 calls: Greenville (81), Mason (21), New Ipswich (72) and Temple (6). In the last four

months, there has been a 20% increase in calls.

We wish to offer special thanks to the Greenville Legion Post Number 13, for donating \$400.00 to purchase two resuscitators; also to the Souhegan Lions Club and the Greenville Lions Club who each donated \$150.00 for the purchase of two scoop stretchers.

PRELIMINARY REPORT DUMP COMMITTEE, TOWN OF GREENVILLE

The town moderator appointed a committee to study what course of action should be taken in order to comply with state and federal laws which prohibit dump burning

after July 1, 1975.

Your committee met with representatives from the towns of New Ipswich, Mason and Temple. This included members of the dump committees, selectmen and planning board. It was determined that none of the existing dumps were suitable for operation after July 1, 1975. There appeared to be three options: (1) each town could maintain its own landfill dump, (2) the four towns could co-operate in maintaining a single landfill dump, (3) the four towns could maintain an incinerator.

Inasmuch as the Southwestern N.H. Planning Commission had hired the C. E. Maguire Co., to undertake a "Regional Solid Waste Management Study" it was decided that we should wait for that engineering analysis and recommendations. The results of that study were presented to the representatives of the four towns at the end of January.

As a result of the presentation the consensus of opinion was that the four towns should join together in maintaining a solid waste, landfill dump. It was further felt that additional sites should be looked into and further discussions held between the four towns before any specific recommendation was made.

GREENVILLE PARK AND PLAYGROUND COMMISSION ANNUAL REPORT - 1973

The Greenville Park and Playground Commission can again report a successful season at the Pelletier Memorial Pool. The pool opened immediately after school closed in June and remained open through Labor Day—a 10 week season, rather than 8. The Pool Director was Lorna Buttrick; her staff included Michael Steele as Instructor and Life Guard, and Steven Bourgeois, Life Guard. During several periods of extreme heat, the pool was filled to capacity.

Swimming instruction was given in the mornings, an adult class met in the evening; the pool was open for free swimming in the afternoons and evenings. A swim team participated in meets with New Ipswich and Milford.

Wooden benches were placed in the pool area, and were much appreciated by parents and swimmers. Large towel

bars were also installed in the bathhouse.

New posts were installed at the entrance to the field, with a cable, to discourage unauthorized travel on the field.

Russell Cook, Jr., again did the mowing at the field and cared for the Myrtle Marsh Memorial Park.

The Commission plans to complete a Little League field this spring; this will include fencing, and a new backstop.

The Commission appreciates the cooperation of the Selectmen and other Town Departments. We especially appreciate the support of the townspeople in our fund raising activities. A Spring Concert, a Christmas Concert, and the Annual Lawn Party enabled us to reimburse \$2,000 to the Town, toward pool maintenance expenses.

On the first Wednesday of each month from 9:30 to 2 p.m. the District Consultant, Mrs. Rachel Sanborn, holds office hours at the Wadleigh Memorial Library in Milford. This gives all librarians in the Southeast District the opportunity to meet with her and talk over library activities and

In looking back over the past year it is with a sense of gratification that we can report the various activities and

accomplishments of the Library and its staff.

Many new names have been added to our circulation files, and this is a sign of growth. This past year 6489 young people and 2232 adults have borrowed books, magazines and records. Fiction books circulated numbered 2115 adult and 4510 children's books. This figure includes 43 adult and 94 children's French books. We have 32 adult novels written in French and 54 children's French books and 1 record in French. These were a gift to the Library from the School Bilingual Program.

Non-fiction books and magazines circulated totaled 4324. There were 539 records borrowed. We have 317 records

available for borrowing.

There were 7 Time/Life Gardening books purchased this year from the remainder of the Memorial Fund for Mrs. Gertrude Houghton. The Library now has the complete set of 12 volumes. These books prove to be very popular in the spring of the year.

REPORT OF THE FOREST FIRE WARDEN AND DISTRICT CHIEF

The New Hampshire Forest Fire Service is represented in every town, city or unorganized place in our state by the forest fire warden. Anyone wishing to kindle an outside fire when the ground is not covered with snow must first obtain the written permission of the fire warden. Except for cooking fires, no fire can be kindled between 9:00 a.m. and 5:00 p.m. unless it is a commercial or industrial burn, or it is raining. The fire warden is assisted in his work by the District Forest Fire Chief, who works for the Department of Resources and Economic Development Forest Fire Service.

Fire prevention was, again this year, the most important part of the Forest Fire Warden's job. Fire statistics show the need, with 72% of the fires caused by smoking, debris burning and children. Smokey the Bear is an important prevention tool, but he still needs much help from the public. Parents should warn their children of the hazards of playing with matches. Children tend to forget that a lighted match held in their hand is a potential forest fire.

POLICE DEPARTMENT ANNUAL REPORT - 1973

Increased training has been of major importance in 1973. The State has strongly encouraged increased training of police officers and has enforced a new criminal code. In accordance with this, I have attended training sessions of the New Hampshire Police Standards and Training Council on prosecution, drug abuse and especially on the new criminal code. Officer Philip Alix has attended special classes on photography and basic fingerprinting.

This year we have scheduled training classes for all Greenville Police Officers and other officers in the area towns. Police Chief Gilson of Mason and myself are looking in to the possibility of taking a course in administering the

Breathelizer Test.

You will note in our list of criminal complaints that there has been an overall increase of 7.5% increase in the number of complaints received during the year. There has been a 6.4% increase in the number of Motor Vehicle Violations and where we had only three (3) breaks in 1972, we had nine (9) in 1973 (a 200% increase). Although this is minimal as compared to the percentage of breaks occurring in neighboring towns, we urge anyone who notices anything suspicious around someone's property, to please call 878-1611. If you plan to leave your home for any length of time, we suggest that you inform a neighbor, relative or the police department.

We thank all our Out of Town Police Officers for their continued cooperation and especially for their help with the July parade and street dance. Special thanks also to Nelson's Answering Service for their help and cooperation.

priations in the next few years but certainly are confronted with major increases. The sewer project will change the tax structure considerably but there is little if anything we can do about this except resign ourselves to the inevitable. The longer we procrastinate, the higher our costs will be. To be sure, not one of us likes higher taxes but there are times we cannot avoid the issues.

The Finance Committee extends an invitation to anyone wishing to serve on this committee to submit their name to either our Town Moderator, the Selectmen or the Chairman of our committee.

SPECIAL ARTICLES

1. \$4,000 request to repair the fire department building. The river is undermining the foundation of the building where the ambulance and tanker truck are housed. An estimate of \$3,800 has been received to adequately repair the building.

In the interest of maintaining our town's assets we recom-

mend the adoption of this article.

2. Three mobile radios for fire department at a cost of \$3,000. This request is to have communication equipment in the chief's car and the cars of his two assistants.

The finance committee recommends the town appropriate the sum of \$1,000 to purchase a mobile radio for the chief's vehicle.

3. The Police department requests \$1,000 to purchase a 4 band radio to replace the 1 band radio in the station.

The Finance Committee recommends the adoption of this article mainly because of increased communication effectiveness between our police and the state police, ambulance service and other local towns.

4. A request of \$14,000 to rebuild an existing town road which passes through Parker-Dearborn trailer complex.

The Finance Committee's consensus of opinion was that the town must maintain and repair this existing accepted road. Therefore, we recommend the adoption of this article.

5. A special article concerning the town dump will be

presented for your consideration.

We cannot make a recommendation on this article because of additional meetings being held by the study committee. We do, however, recognize the pressing need to make a decision soon.

CONCLUSION

The Finance Committee wishes to express its thanks to all department heads for their cooperation and for their continued effort to keep the budget within reasonable operating limits. We do not foresee any reduction in budgetary appro2. Town officers' expense increased by \$1,000. This reflects a sharp rise in products, particularly paper, plus \$400 to print the assessment report which was a directive of the 1968 town meeting.

The Finance Committee agrees with this increase.

- 3. Town Hall and other buildings increased by \$1,000 which reflects additional fuel costs.
- 4. The police department budget has increased by \$2,100. \$1,600 of the increase is to cover wages of special officers riding double. The remaining \$500 is to increase the chief's salary.

We recommend this increase because many times officers are not paid when riding double. In addition, the chief has received the same salary for five years and has made expenditures in the police office at no cost to the town.

5. Fire department budget has increased by \$3,000 over last year's estimate mainly because their budget was cut last year by \$2,385 with the instruction that they use excess funds accumulated from previous years. Their 1973 actual expenditure exceeds the requested appropriation.

We thank them for their cooperation last year and recommend the requested appropriation.

6. Town maintenance (summer and winter roads) \$1,500 increase.

Since there are several requests involved with the highway department and funds used in various ways, the Finance Committee feels that summer and winter roads be reduced from a request of \$17,500 to \$16,000 which is the same as last year's appropriation.

7. Ambulance service has increased from \$1,550 to \$3,875. This is equivalent to \$2.50 per capita.

We recommend this increase which is necessary for two reasons: one is operating costs (gasoline, etc.) and the other is the replacement of the third ambulance.

FINANCE COMMITTEE REPORT

The Finance Committee appointed by the moderator and approved by the Selectmen met with the several department heads over a two week period. During the meetings all interested parties were heard and at our final meeting we deliberated extensively over the many items carefully.

As you all know, costs of fuel, building products and services have risen sharply this past year. With this thought in mind, the Finance Committee feels the revenue and appropriation operating budget is realistic.

Our specific recommendations are herewith submitted

for your consideration.

REVENUE

Generally, revenue does not fluctuate greatly. However, the following items which have increased are encouraging.

The remaining differences are not significant.

EXPENDITURES

Most of the estimated expenses have risen slightly because of increased purchasing costs.

Major variances and our comments are outlined below:

1. Town officer's salaries increased \$1,200. The Selectmen recommend the tax collector's salary be raised by \$1,000 and the treasurer's salary be raised by \$200.

We concur with this increase.

Article 18: Voted to elect five members for the Parks and Playgrounds Commission for five year terms, staggered

so that one member's term will expire each year.

Article 19: Voted to authorize the Mascenic Regional School District to elect its officers at the Annual Town Meeting, beginning in 1974.

Article 20: Voted to pass over the article to raise and appropriate \$3,498.00 as the Town's share of the Meals-on-Wheels program.

REPORT OF THE SCHOOL NURSE

1972-1973

The school year ended with no major mishaps even though several children had to go to the Doctor's office or

the hospital for further treatment.

Physicals were started early in the fall in order to meet the State Law Requirements. Grades One, Four, Seven and all the athletes were examined by our school physician, Dr. Robert Wellwood. Of the 377 children examined the following defects were noted. These children with defects took home notes signed by the Doctor.

48 Carious teeth

1 Excessive tartar on teeth

22 Wax in the ears

Tuberculin Testing was done on the faculty, custodians, aides, secretaries, bus drivers and the cooks by Miss Constance Martin, R.N., State Public Health Nurse.

All first graders were given the Tine test by the school

nurse. This test was sponsored by our local Salvation Army Unit. All children had negative results.

Dental Health Week was observed. Proctor & Gamble again supplied all third grades with a Crest dental kit. Arrangements have been made for all the elementary grades to receive dental care by a registered Dental Hygienist for a small fee in the fall.

First grade registration was held at the New Ipswich Congregational Church with the Greenville Lions Club as co-sponsors with the Mascenic School District, on May 15, 1973. The VASC Testing was carried out by the PSVS program of the Division of Public Health under the direction of Mrs. Nathalie Smith, R.N. This program included all four and five year old children.

Ninety-nine children were tested and 13 were referred for re-tests.

Parents of children who are entering the first grade were asked to fill out the necessary forms. Mr. Robert Rogers was present in order to make appointments for the Gesell testing. A special thank-you is in order for the Church for providing us a nice place to do the testing, the Lions Club for providing the red piggybanks and the balloons, and for the many volunteer helpers: Mrs. Pearl Thompson, Mrs. Ann Aldrich, Mrs. Florence Cook, Mrs. Sandra Short, Mrs. Pat Thayer, Mrs. Dot Vaillancourt, Mrs. Shirley Niskala, Mrs. Barbara Lehtonen, Mrs. Sandy Lehtonen, Miss Susan Eaton, Mrs. Dot White, Mrs. Rhoda Chase, Mrs. Langille, Mrs. Rousseau, Mrs. Nathalie Smith for making it possible to test all these children.

The N.H. Measles Alert announcement resulted in a questionnaire being sent home urging parents to get immunization for the children who had not had the disease or immunization. Over 91 children in the Mascenic School came down with the measles. The lower grades were more fortunate, for many of them had had the immunization when it was first offered at the clinics.

The Public Health Dept. under the direction of Mrs. Marion Howard, Public Health Nurse, sponsored 3 im-

munization clinics at the Greenville Legion Post on March 30, April 27th and May 25th. Immunizations were given for Polio, DPT, German and Regular Measles and a few Mumps. There were 194 immunizations given. A thank-you for the Legion, Volunteer Nurses and others that provided the clerical work is expressed.

The nurse's work consisted mostly of first aid for cuts, scratches, sprains, bruises, insect bites, snake bite, mouse

bite, blisters, burns, bloody noses, etc.

Heights and weights.

Blood Pressures on all 7th graders and athletes.

Hair inspections. Several had nits and lice and were excluded from school until proper treatment was used.

Absenteeism was checked, especially in the High School

area.

Arrangements were made for sick children to go home. Eye and Ear Testing was done on teacher requests. Consultation with parents was conducted.
